- 5) **Workgroup reports:**
 - a) **Resource Assessment and Evaluation : Risk and Protective Factors Assessment :**
They have had 2 meetings and have passed out lists of contacts to group members. Short phone survey will be done with these contacts. The group hopes to meet next Tuesday to decide which contacts should have a personal interview in helping to find programs.
 - b) **The Risk Group:** They gave a presentation to the Baraga School Board. Also have been informed the Arvon School board would be interested in a presentation.
